



CURRICULUM 2006-7

In the next two weeks pupils in Years 9 and 11 will have completed their option choices for 2006-7. This is a very important process and we have tried to reduce some of the problems identified in the straw polls conducted earlier this term. In what will be a difficult year financially (the available budget news for 2006-7 is very bleak) the governors have already decided to make their policy of maximum curriculum choice **a major priority** in the detailed planning that takes places at this time of year. In the next newsletter I hope to report on the outcomes of all this work and confirm the curriculum decisions made by the governors.

ROAD SAFETY

In recent assemblies I have been emphasising to pupils once again the importance of road safety. Major areas of concern have been the scant attention paid to road traffic by some pupils crossing the road from the bus island in the morning in particular and carelessness in crossing the roads in both the Waunfawr and Cefn Llan. Parents will know from previous newsletters that this is not a new issue and it is a **message that needs constant reinforcement**. Please could you help by ensuring that your son / daughter is aware of the dangers and knows how to cross a road safely – despite our best efforts and yours it is obvious that not all pupils are sufficiently clued up on this!

PENGLAIS SCHOOL WEBSITE

Penglais School has a new website. It can be found on www.penglaischool.org.uk This is an interactive website which is still being developed. A new section has recently been added allowing students and staff, in a secure area, to exchange information including setting and marking work.

DEPARTMENTAL NEWS

BUSINESS

On Wednesday 8th February, year 12 business students attended an enterprise workshop at the Arts Centre. In the morning students attended practical workshops on setting up their own business and creative problem solving. The second workshop was very hands on with students (and Mrs Shaw) getting involved in various activities to solve business problems. Activities included brain writing, brainstorming and solving problems by adopting the traits of famous characters.

Undoubtedly, the highlight of the day was the afternoon session. The guest speaker for the afternoon session was Stephen Parry, the Olympic bronze medallist in the butterfly 2004. He highlighted the importance of focus, drive and motivation. He showed us a very motivating video clip of his Olympic swimming victory. He explained to the group how determined he had been to win a medal that year as previously he had just missed medal positions. He was so determined to win a medal that in the build up to his Olympic swim, he changed his bank account pin number to the time he believed he would need to swim within to get a medal!

Stephen Parry explained to the students how it felt to actually be ahead of USA's Micheal Phelps and the disappointment he felt when Phelps and Japan's Takashi Yamamoto passed him to clinch the gold and silver medals. Stephen has taken his motivation and drive and used it to set up several successful businesses. The clear message that students took from the day was that you need to work towards your dreams and believe in yourself.

MEDIA STUDIES

This year has seen the addition of a new AS course to the sixth form curriculum in Penglais – Media Studies. Last term, as part of their work on cinema, students saw a screening of the classic film noir 'The Third Man' in the Arts Centre, courtesy of Film Education; this was a proper celluloid copy, not something digitally re-mastered on DVD. Then on the Friday before half term the group went to Coleg Ceredigion to meet 'BB Aled', one of Chris Moyle's Radio One broadcasting team. Aled, who grew up in Aberystwyth, talked to them about his career and opportunities in the media.

As part of their Media Studies course, students are required to complete coursework that involves using a range of different types of media. This includes both digital video and digital photography and the school has had to purchase new equipment to allow students the opportunity to work with film and film editing. We have been very grateful for a substantial donation of £2,000 given by the PTA towards the cost of the equipment.
