UNIFORM

ISSUES

This is a reminder to parents and pupils about suitable footwear for school.

This summer a number of pupils has come to school wearing flip flops, open toed sandals and similar footwear. These items are totally unsuitable for a number of reasons:

- ☐ They cause problems for teachers of all practical subjects such as Design Technology (including Food Technology), Catering, Science etc. The dangers of spillage or accidents are obvious.
- ☐ Pupils are more likely to trip with this footwear thus causing problems for themselves and others, particularly on staircases.

The school will be conducting a full uniform review during the autumn term. The uniform policy has not been reviewed for many years and consultation will take place with pupils, parents, staff and governors of the school.

In the meantime, listed below is the current and correct uniform list that we expect **ALL** our pupils to wear:

Year 7-11

Correct school uniform is a white or pale blue poloshirt with the Penglais logo and a navy sweatshirt with the Penglais logo. Boys must wear grey or black trousers with a conventional design. Girls must wear either a navy or black skirt or navy or black full length trousers of a conventional design.

Years 12 and 13

All sixth form pupils must wear a black top in one of the approved styles which displays the school logo and black or grey trousers.

Can we also remind you that if your child is having his or her ears pierced over the holidays that this is done early so that the jewellery can be removed in **all practical lessons** including PE, Design Technology and Science.

PTA FUND RAISING

The PTA has set itself a huge fund raising target for next year. The intention is to carry out a long overdue renovation of the Main School Hall. The Hall desperately requires new seating, new curtains, a better sound system and furniture. This will create a much better environment for assemblies, meetings, outside speakers and, of course, school events and productions. (See later in the newsletter for news on GREASE)

The PTA has already saved £8,000 to put towards this project and that is after meeting all its targets for this year. The PTA will continue to support school clubs and societies and hopes to raise another £20,000 for the hall project.

PLEASE make every effort to support the fund raising events of the PTA in the autumn – every pound will count.

BUSES

Two years ago the local education authority, at great expense, installed seat belts onto school buses. Despite constant reminders and letters home, pupils are not wearing the seat belts.

We do carry out spot checks every so often but we cannot check every bus, every day and, in any event, what happens after the bus has left school premises is not under our control.

I have asked the local education authority to have the seat belt rule enforced: that is a bus driver does not leave school premises unless all the pupils are sat down with seat belts on. We will support any bus driver who does this.

I understand that from September the law will change and that the seat belt rule will be enforced by the police and the local education authority. After all the publicity about accidents with school buses I am amazed that this is still an issue. Sooner or later a bus driver will at the very least have to brake sharply. If a child is not wearing a seat belt unnecessary injuries may result.


LOST PROPERTY
