



## STAFFING

Mrs. Jane Leggett is retiring as Head of Music at the end of this term. She has worked at the school since 1987 and has been Head of Music since 1998. Her contribution to the school and its musical tradition has been truly outstanding. Her inspirational teaching and incredible capacity for hard work have enthused and energised pupils and colleagues alike. We all remember the superb concerts and performances that Jane has organised and directed over the

years: she will be sorely missed. At the end of such a distinguished career we wish her a well-deserved and happy retirement.

Mr. M. Bassett-Jones, who has taught Health and Social Care and Science at the school for the last two years is leaving for a new post in the London Borough of Barnet. Ms. K. Porter who has taught English for the last three years is moving with her family to South Africa at the end of term. Miss E. Jones who has taught Welsh and played a significant role in developing the Welsh ethos

of the school in the last two years, is leaving for a new post in Bangor. Mr. M. Bonser who has taught Modern Languages at the school for the last eight years is leaving his part-time post to devote more time to his business. We wish them all the very best in the future.

Mr. M. Brown (Deputy Headteacher) is being seconded to the local education authority's advisory team in 2009-10 and Mr. M. Francis (Head of English) is taking a year's sabbatical to carry out research and writing.

We wish them both well in their new ventures and will welcome them back to school the following year!

Several colleagues are returning in September with part-time posts: Mrs. M. Collin (SEN), Mrs. M. Lindsay (SEN) and Mrs. S. Morris-Jones (Welsh)

At the time of writing all vacancies at the school have been filled and in the September newsletter new colleagues will be introduced.

## BUILDINGS AND PREMISES

An enormous amount of work improving the school environment is taking place this summer:

- three science laboratories are being completely refurbished
- both food technology rooms are being completely refurbished
- new ICT centres have been created in the Library, the History and Geography departments
- two new classrooms are being built near the sixth form centre, ready for September
- replacement windows are being installed in the Administration block and D Block
- the male staff toilets are being renovated
- the school canteen is receiving new furniture and some new facilities; we are also installing a servery in the sixth form centre.

The school has received a £10,000 grant to install solar heating panels in one part of the school. We also hope to provide some limited additional car parking space too.

In the autumn term we intend to refurbish the main foyer and the entrance to M1/M2 at the rear of the school. In the spring, two of the Mathematics rooms will be refurbished.

## CAR PARKING

The recent changes to Cefn Llan and the restriction of parking in that area have meant an increase in traffic at the back of the school. This is causing us great problems in the rear car park at the end of the school day.

Some parents are bringing cars to pick up their children into an already narrow car park. This is causing a number of health and safety problems:

- Pupils from the Learning Support Centre meet their taxis and minibuses in the rear car park. This means that the most vulnerable children in the school have to negotiate an increasingly busy car park. It has also meant that their transport (which is planned to leave the school at the earliest opportunity) has been frequently delayed by parents' cars blocking the way out.
- Large numbers of pupils leave school via the rear entrance to walk home. Staff on duty report increasing problems with traffic entering the site whilst children are leaving.

We have examined the problem and taken advice. The best solution is to let the children from the Learning Support Centre continue to use the rear car park – it is the shortest distance from their classroom to the taxis / minibuses and it avoids the area where the rest of the buses operate. The rear car park will however be closed to all other traffic at this time of day and staff will be on duty to ensure that only the taxis and the minibus for the children from the Learning Support Centre use the rear car park.

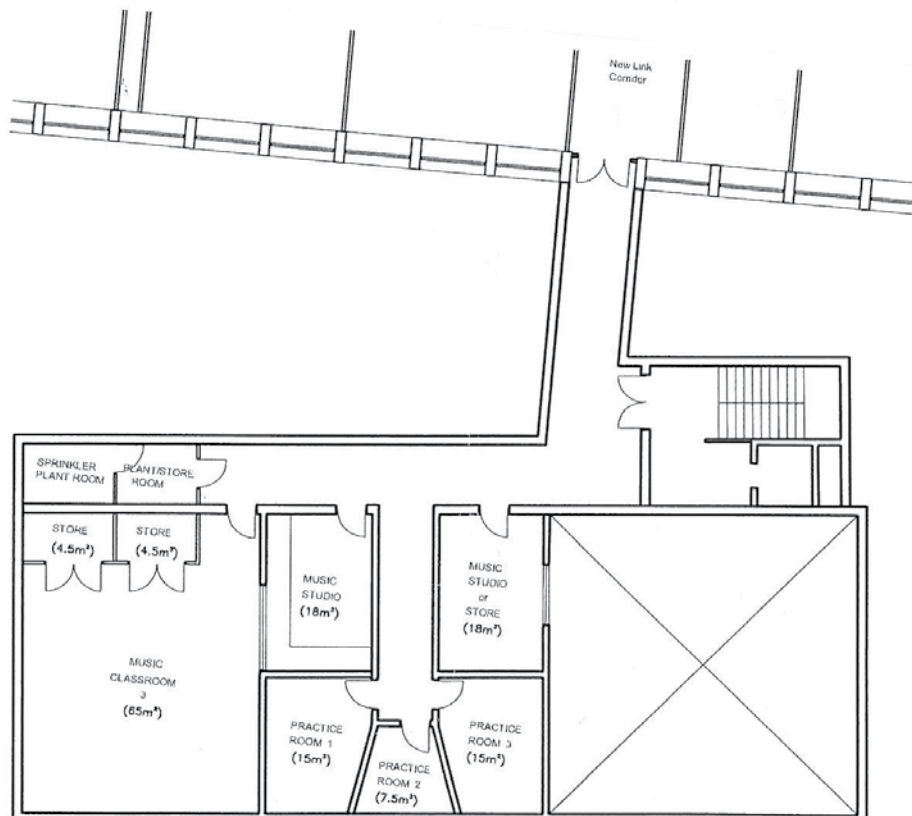
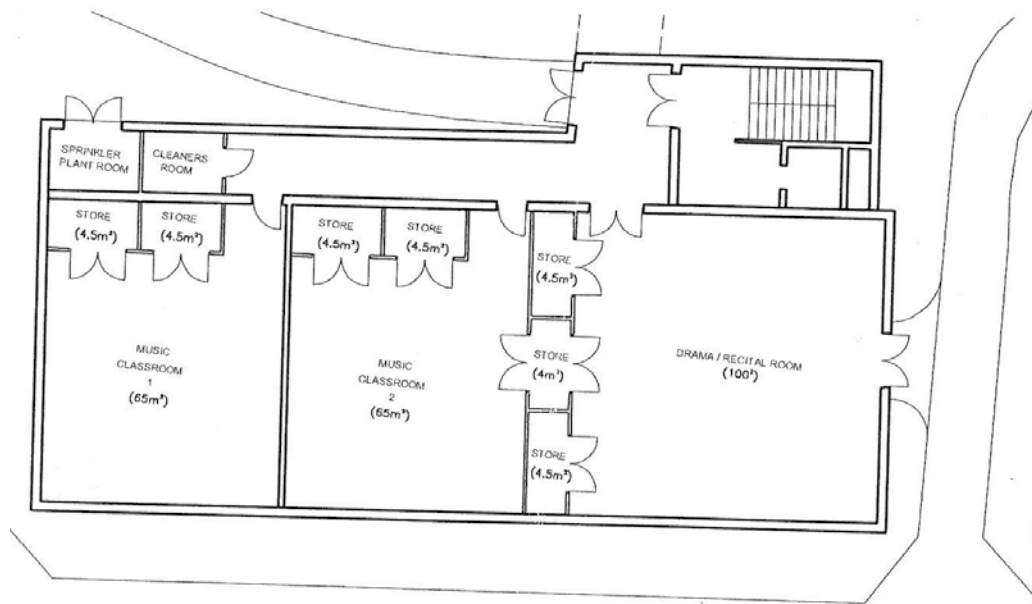
If parents wish to bring cars onto school premises to collect children at the end of the school day we would like you to park in the **lower** hard court area. This will reduce the risk of congestion and safety hazards. It will mean that patience is needed as the buses will be allowed to leave school premises

first. This is carried out under the direction of senior staff and it is usually completed by 3.30pm.

I do hope that parents understand the reasons for these decisions which are important to reduce health and safety risks and, of course, you need to consider your own personal liability in case of accidents.

## SENIOR MANAGEMENT POSTS 2009-10

Key Stage 3: Years 7, 8 and 9  
 Key Stage 4: Years 9 and 10  
 Key Stage 5: Years 12 and 13

In September 2009 the Head of Key Stage 3 will be Mrs. H.G. Griffiths; the Head of Key Stage 5 is Mrs. S. Payne.

The Head of Key Stage 4 will be appointed later in the year.

The Head of Key Stage 3 is a new post and Mrs. Griffiths will be concentrating on the changes to the curriculum in Key Stage 3, developing links with all feeder primary schools and overseeing assessment throughout Years 7, 8 and 9.

## CATERING

52 Year 10 pupils have just completed their first practical exam, accounting for 15% of their final mark. All catering staff, Mr Jones and Mrs Grasham were very impressed by the high standard of their cooking and presentation. We are also grateful for parents helping their child to practise over half term and organising the ingredients. During the last two weeks of June and the first week of July all these pupils will have a one week work placement in local restaurants, cafes and hotels, and the report they complete afterwards will account for 20% of their final mark. The school is very grateful for the goodwill shown by local businesses to help the pupils meet this course requirement. Next spring the pupils will be prepared in school for their final practical, which will account for 25% of their final mark.



## DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

**Textiles – Bags, bags and even more bags!** – Not only did we manage to raise almost £400 for the local charity Beacon of Hope we also managed to come second in the Simplicity Competition. As a result the department now has two brand new sewing machines, a selection of Simplicity patterns and numerous reels of thread. Well done to all those involved.

**Food** – The food technology rooms are at long last being refurbished and will be in use, looking very stylish, at the start of the new school year. The rooms will be out of action until the end of the summer term and we apologise to all those who cannot use the rooms in school at the moment.

**Resistant Materials** – In the next few weeks we will be taking delivery of a brand new laser cutter and Mr. Davies, Mrs. Balchin, Mr. Evans and Mr. Kelsey are all getting very excited about this! It will be used by pupils in all key stages to enhance their practical work when using a range of materials. Thanks to the LEA and Mr. Rudge for making this possible.





## Army Careers Exhibition

On Friday 8<sup>th</sup> May Mr P Jones and Dr Minchin led a party of 38 Year 9 and 10 pupils to an Army exhibition day at Bodelwyddan Castle. Careers advice was available for those interested in joining the army, and there were numerous activities for all to get

involved in, to develop key skills like communication and working as part of a team. Penglais was represented in all the inter-school challenges of obstacle course, tug-of-war, and penalty shoot out. Over 2 days all secondary schools from North Wales to Aberystwyth were invited to attend and over 1,000 pupils attended. We narrowly lost the final of the boys' tug-of-war but won the boys' penalty shoot out. We also had success in the jerry-can lift, with Becky Hill and Emyr Hopkins defeating all others

in the U15 category. As well as all the competitions there were many other activities for pupils, including wall climbing, cooking, mechanics and motor cross, as well as a display by the heavy artillery.

Sergeant Major Matthias and Captain Jamieson came into school on Thursday the 22<sup>nd</sup> June to present the victorious pupils with their army shirt and award.

## MEDIA STUDIES



On the 17<sup>th</sup> June, Year 12 Media Studies students attended 'DS4', the Fourth Festival of Digital Storytelling at Aberystwyth Arts Centre. Penglais students have been to sessions at previous festivals, but this was the first time that they had been able to take part in the whole day's activities. The Festival was created to inspire, encourage and demonstrate the exciting possibilities of digital storytelling and our students attended lectures and breakout sessions run by celebrated international digital storytellers. At the start of the first session, Huw Edwards, formerly with the BBC, introduced his storytelling project based around a community in North Wales. Having found by chance original footage of everyday local life in 1950s Wales, Edwards returned to the community with the help of secondary school students, to interview some of the original participants. He was followed on stage by Annette Mees of 'Coney', an agency for adventure, immersive theatre and play, who described how her work with communities in Shoreditch in London helped to bring people together from a variety of different backgrounds. A particular high spot was the keynote speaker, Bonnie Shaw, creator of 'Snap-Shot-City', a project which challenges participants to tell a story about where they live through a simultaneous global photographic treasure hunt. Our students were invited to post images of Aberystwyth on to their website and so add a local dimension to this mass visual storytelling project.

There were also practical breakout sessions. Gilly Adams of the Made in Wales Theatre Company ran an enjoyable workshop exploring techniques designed to help people feel confident enough to tell their own story; the BBC's Video Nation team introduced students to the techniques that are used in making a Video Nation short and there were short presentations by other digital storytellers working in a variety of innovative and unusual ways.

During the lunch break, some Penglais students boarded the BBC Video Bus and were initiated into the mysteries of the microphone and sound recording, while others found themselves locked into the strange virtual world of Cab a Go Go. The students certainly enjoyed the broad range of activities available and we are grateful to Aberystwyth Arts Centre for allowing us to participate in the Festival. Penglais Media Studies students are now engaged in their own digital storytelling projects and will certainly have learned from their experiences at DS4.

## SCIENCE

A Year 8 team comprising Joe Nagaoka-Taylor, Arnie Blakemore, Peter Henson and Bryn Mortice-Wait, competed in the Salter Chemistry Competition at Aberystwyth University on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> June. 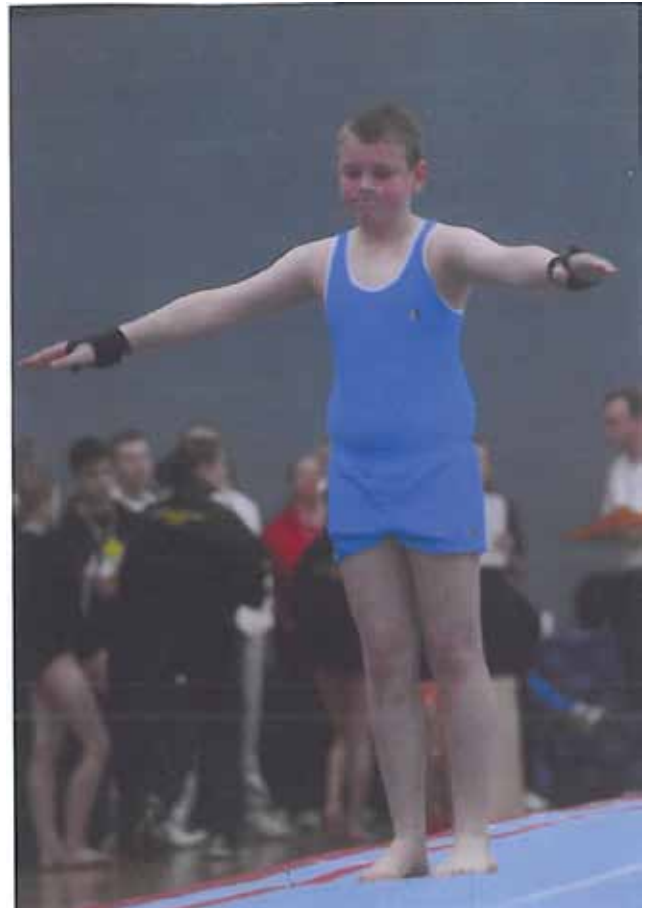
