



## STAFFING

This summer sees a significant number of retirements from the teaching staff. Mr. A.W. Gillbey, Deputy Headteacher, is retiring after 34 years' service at the school. Before becoming a senior manager he built up a highly successful and popular History department and he is a respected and influential Chief Examiner for A Level History. The continuing popularity of History as an examination subject throughout Wales owes much to his leadership and skill. He has also been a very effective and hard working deputy headteacher at Penglais who has been a tremendous support for me in running the school, at one point as acting headteacher whilst I worked for the local education authority for a term. He will be greatly missed both as a teacher and a school manager.

Mr. A.W. Wells retired earlier this year as Assistant Headteacher. Mr. Wells joined the school in 1989 as Head of Mathematics and he led by example, as an inspirational teacher of mathematics. Large numbers of pupils have great cause to thank him for his ability to make mathematics accessible and in giving them the confidence to succeed at all levels in the subject. Since 2004 he has also been an Assistant Headteacher with the important responsibility of day to day management of a large, busy comprehensive school. In this role he has also contributed to many other aspects of school management including the training of teachers and staff and performance management. The school is fortunate that he will still be able to help us with a small part-time contract teaching mathematics.

Mr. M. Francis has also retired earlier this year. He was appointed to the staff in 1986 and took over the English department in 1999. He has led one of the largest departments in the school during that time overseeing continuously improving examination results. The department's record at A Level has been particularly impressive both in terms of the numbers opting for the subject and also in the quality of

the grades attained. Again the school is very fortunate that Mr. Francis can help us with a small part time contract in the future to teach A Level English.

Mrs. S.M. Jones has taught at Penglais since 1979, becoming Head of the Welsh department in 1999. Before that she had been second in the Welsh department, for many years organising the school's St. David's Day celebrations. A loyal and caring colleague, she led a large department as well as overseeing many changes in the school including the introduction of Welsh First Language courses. Before going part-time she also acted as the school's Examinations Officer for two years. Mrs. S.M. Jones will retire at the end of the summer after an impressive 31 years service at the school.

Mrs. M. Scully will be retiring at the end of the summer after 10 years' service at the school teaching English and Dr. M. Couch leaves us after 3 years to take up a new post in Somerset.

We wish all these colleagues the very best in their retirements and new posts.

There are also a number of Learning Support Assistants who are leaving at the end of term: Kayleigh Taylor is leaving us to take up another post, Ryan Pryce is going to Cardiff University to study Business, Daniel Owen will be studying History at Manchester University and Silk Younger will be studying Midwifery at Swansea University. David Charnock is off to college to study Access to Health and Social Care, David Macfarlane will be studying Social Work at Bangor University and Dorothea Havard will be retiring. Other Learning Support Assistants who will be finishing with us at the end of term are Anjali Roy, James Cartwright, Julie Thomas and Lucy Evans. Isabel Pereda's part time contract also expires at the end of term. We wish them all well in their new ventures and retirement.

## OTHER STAFF CHANGES

There have been several important changes for the start of the new academic year and a full list will be given in the first newsletter of the new term.

Mrs. Rudge will be the new Head of Key Stage Three and Mrs. Adamson will be the new Head of Key Stage Four. Mr. P. Jones, Mrs. R. Allen and Mr. G. ### Review of the Year





## HEALTHY EATING AT PENGLAIS

Just to update you on Healthy Eating at school. The Canteen has continued to develop a range of healthy recipes which are served daily at reasonable prices from £1. The school is currently following guidelines from the Welsh Assembly. Their booklet ‘Appetite for Life’ states that all meals must be of nutritional benefit and should contain a maximum of 3% fat, less sugar and more fibre and increase the intake of fruit and vegetables. Drinks permitted are milk, water, unsweetened fruit juices and alternatives such as rice and soya milk. This policy is being upheld by the Canteen but unfortunately the same cannot be said for packed lunches brought into school. We would be grateful for your support in ensuring packed lunches meet the school’s criteria for Healthy Schools.

**Table 1: Summary of recommended food standards for school lunches in Wales Food Standards**

Fruit and vegetables	Not less than 2 portions per day per child (at least one must be vegetables or salad, and at least one must be fruit). This should provide a variety of fruits, vegetables and salads over the 5 day period.
Oily fish	On the school lunch menu at least once every two weeks.
Deep fried potato products	Potatoes and potato products cooked in fat/oils in the school kitchen or during manufacture <sup>15</sup> must not be served more than twice a week.
Deep fried products	Other food items (other than potatoes) cooked in fat/oils in the school kitchen or during manufacture must not be served more than twice a week.
Manufactured meat products	Should not be reformed/reconstituted foods
Bread (without spread)	Available throughout lunch. A variety of breads should be encouraged including wholemeal bread.
Confectionery and savoury snacks	Not to be made available.
Salt	Not added to vegetables during cooking. Restrict or remove salt from recipes and replace with appropriate and acceptable herbs and spices. Not available at lunch tables or at the service counter.

**Table 3: Drinks Permitted in Secondary Schools Category**

	<b>Content</b>
Plain water (still or carbonated)	No (artificial or natural) sweeteners, sugars, honey, colouring or flavouring may be added.
Fruit juice (still or carbonated)	In compliance with the Fruit Juices and Fruit Nectars (Wales) Regulations 2003 but with no artificial or natural sweeteners used for sweetening
Fruit juice from concentrate (still or carbonated)	
Vegetable juice (still or carbonated)	No sweeteners (artificial or natural), sugars, honey, colouring or flavouring may be added.
Milk (semi-skimmed and skimmed)	No sweeteners (artificial or natural), sugars, honey, colouring or flavouring may be added. Must not contain more than 1.8% fat.
Plain soya, rice or oat drinks fortified with calcium	No sweeteners (artificial or natural), sugars, honey, colouring or flavouring may be added.
Plain yoghurt drinks	No sweeteners (artificial or natural), colouring or flavouring may be added. Less than 5% sugars or honey may be added. Must not contain more than 1.8% fat.


### YEAR 10 CATERING
