

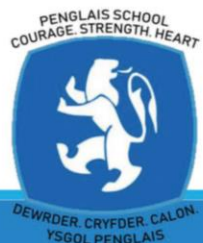


# Year 13 Key Dates



All exam entries and post results are made by Mr P Jones or Miss N Hankey. In Penglais we have up to 900 students sitting exams. You only have to think about your exams so you must take responsibility. Mr Jones and Miss Hankey have other responsibilities in school in addition to exams so do not leave things to the last minute and do not assume they will be available in their office. Most problems are avoided if you ask in good time.

- 1) Cambridge Assessment for BMAT (medicine, vet school, biomed ) Entry window 1<sup>st</sup> September– 1<sup>st</sup> October. Cost £48 payable by candidate. Exam Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> October 9am in the Main Hall – this is during half term.
- 2) Cambridge Admissions Testing Service – Includes History Aptitude Test, Geography aptitude test, Physics Aptitude Test, Oxford Thinking Skills Assessment Entry window 1<sup>st</sup> September – 15<sup>th</sup> October (no charge for candidates) . YOU NEED YOUR UCAS NUMBER to make an entry. Exam date is Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> October 9am in the Main Hall – this is during half term.
- 3) Maths and English linear GCSE re-sit deadline is early – September 30<sup>th</sup>. You must pay before the entry goes in (£38.76)
- 4) January GCSE exam re-sits (e.g. English literacy ) – deadline is October 18<sup>th</sup> . You must pay before the entry goes in.
- 5) Summer exam entries are made in January. A draft exam timetable will be printed at the start of February. If any changes need to be made it is your responsibility to do this **well before** the deadline of February 10<sup>th</sup> If you are studying for an AS subject in Year 13 YOU MUST check that your entries are correct, including a cash in entry before February 10<sup>th</sup> if you intend to receive a final grade for it. There is no ‘automatic’ cash in for modular courses.
- 6) November GCSE results are available in mid January. If you intend to re-sit any of these you have very little time to check fees, bring in payment and have the entry made. Late fees are double cost for WJEC. You must move quickly on these.
- 7) Maths STEP entry window is 24<sup>th</sup> February – 1<sup>st</sup> May. Cost is £54 payable by candidate. Don’t leave to the deadline. STEP 1 exam 9<sup>th</sup> June, STEP 2 15<sup>th</sup> June, STEP 3 19<sup>th</sup> June.
- 8) GCE results are available in school on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> August, between 08.30am – 11.00am. Further details will be confirmed nearer the time. You are strongly advised to collect these results in school as staff will be available to help if required. Results will not be e-mailed or given out over the telephone. Use the priority script 7 day window to order scripts if you are unsure why you got the grade you got – this means the script can be checked before deciding on any review of marking.





# Year 12 Key Dates



All exam entries and post results are made by Mr P Jones or Miss N Hankey. In Penglais we have up to 900 students sitting exams per year. You only have to think about your exams so you must take responsibility. Mr Jones and Miss Hankey have other responsibilities in school in addition to exams so do not leave things to the last minute and do not assume they will be available in their office. Most problems are avoided if you ask in good time.

- 1) Maths linear GCSEs re-sit deadline is early – September 30<sup>th</sup> . Discuss this with the department first. Unless you are registered and taught in a timetabled class for this then you must pay £38.76 before the entry is put in.
- 2) January GCSE exam re-sits (e.g. Legacy series ) – deadline is October 20<sup>th</sup> . You must pay before the entry goes in.
- 3) Summer exam entries are made in January. A draft exam timetable and statement of entry will be printed at the start of February. If any changes need to be made it is your responsibility to do this **well before** the exams staff deadline of February 10<sup>th</sup>.
- 4) GCE results are available in school on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> August, between 08.30am– 11.00am. Further details will be confirmed nearer the time, You are strongly advised to collect these results in school as staff will be available to help if required. Results will not be e-mailed or given out over the telephone. You can use priority script recall for 7 days after the results day.

Aim to pass your GCE exams at the first time of asking, re-sits are expensive and they are only available in the Summer exam series. Re-sits also use up a lot of time and effort you could be spending on your Year 13 studies. Be aware that if you repeat a year and wish to sit a unit for a third time this will trigger a 'fresh start' and you will have to sit all the units in the same season, and these results will be the ones used in awarding an overall grade. Also, be aware that some universities and some courses **DO NOT** accept any re-sit results.



# Year 11 Key Dates



All exam entries and post results are made by Mr P Jones and Miss N Hankey. In Penglais we have up to 900 students sitting exams per year. You only have to think about your exams so you must take responsibility. Mr Jones and Miss Hankey have other responsibilities in school in addition to exams so do not leave things to the last minute and do not assume they will be available in their office. Most problems are avoided if you ask in good time.

- 1) January exams – Only a few subjects offer some unit exams in January e.g. English Literature, Health and Social Care. The deadline is October 20<sup>th</sup>. You must pay before the entry goes in.
- 2) In March and April you will have a lot of controlled assessment deadlines, including language oral exams, PE practical assessments.
- 3) Summer exam entries are made in January. A draft exam timetable and statement of entry will be printed off and given to you at the start of February. If any changes need to be made it is your responsibility to do this and see Mr Jones or Miss Hankey **well before** the exams staff deadline of February 10<sup>th</sup>. You need to check for any entries not needed, any missing entries and entries at the wrong tier. Any changes after this date will be at your own expense.
- 4) GCSE results are available in school on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> August, between 08.30am– 11.00am. Further details will be confirmed nearer the time. You are strongly advised to collect these results in school as staff will be available to help if required. You will also be able to check overall marks and grade boundaries on this morning. You have 7 days from results day to order and pay for priority scripts – this allows you to check your work before deciding on any review of marking. Results will not be e-mailed or given out over the telephone.

Aim to pass your Year 11 exams at the first time of asking, re-sits are expensive and use up a lot of time and effort you could be spending on your Year 12 studies if you choose to re-sit any next year.



# Year 10 Key Dates



All exam entries and post results are made by Mr P Jones and Miss N Hankey. In Penglais we have up to 900 students sitting exams per year. You only have to think about your exams so you must take responsibility. Mr Jones and Miss Hankey have other responsibilities in school in addition to exams so do not leave things to the last minute and do not assume they will be available in their office. Most problems are avoided if you ask in good time.

- 1) In Year 10 you only have one exam season – this is the Summer exam season. Entries are made in January. A draft exam timetable and statement of entry will be printed and given to you at the start of February. If any changes need to be made it is your responsibility to do this **well before** the exams staff deadline of February 10<sup>th</sup>. You need to check for any entries not needed, any missing entries and entries at the wrong tier. If you wish to take an exam in a subject you are not taught here this may be possible, but see Mr Jones or Miss Hankey in good time – do this during January. You will be expected to pay the costs of any exam entries for additional subjects.
- 2) Your exam results at the end of Year 10 will be unit marks and grades (marks and grades for each unit completed). You can collect these results on the morning of GCSE Results' Day (Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> August). Further details on collecting your exam results will be given nearer the time, You are strongly advised to collect these results in school as staff will be available in school to help if required. Results will not be e- mailed or given out over the telephone.

You will have a lot of controlled assessment to complete in Years 10 and 11. The better you do in these the better your final grade is likely to be.

Aim to pass your Year 10 exams at the first time of asking, re-sits are expensive and use up a lot of time and effort you could be spending on your Year 11 studies.
