HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

As we arrive at the end of 2020, there is plenty to reflect on. Yes, it has been a hard and difficult year and it has tested each and every one of us in different ways. However, my overriding impression of the Penglais community in relation to the year is a hugely positive one

The community as a whole has shown resilience, ambition, flexibility and creativity in responding to the situation. In a space of a few days back in March, Penglais successfully turned into a virtual school, with teachers and students suddenly having to master assignments, chats and Teams. Parents suddenly had their children at home and had to juggle their own work along with supporting their children's school work. All staff had to find different ways of working and communicating with each other, again with many juggling work and childcare responsibilities, and did so in good spirits.

Since returning to school in its many different guises since the end of June, staff and students have responded with a fantastic can-do attitude. Everyone has complied incredibly well with the new expectations and demonstrated such a positive attitude to anything new thrust upon them, even at incredibly short notice, as we experienced last week. I wish you all a very Merry Christmas, and here's hoping for a better 2021.

Reminders

PARENT REMINDERS:

We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents and students of some of the requirements now in school:

- We have a new gate system in place, all gates are locked at 8:45am.
- If the student has forgotten an item they need to speak to student services and provisions will be made for them, as parents/visitors are not permitted on school site.
- Remember to give your child enough water to last them throughout the school day.
- Please name all the items students bring to school including jumpers, ties, coats, lunch boxes
- Students need to remember to wear their face covering at all times when on school site, other than in the classrooms

ParentPay

We have now moved to a cash free system called ParentPay.

You will need a ParentPay account to do any of the following:

- Add money to a dinner card and view your child's transaction history on their dinner account
- Pay for exam re-sits
- Pay for any future school trips that are chargeable

What you need to do

- 1. If you have not yet registered for ParentPay, please e-mail Mrs M Williams, Finance Office, on maw@penglais.org.uk to request an activation letter. In this e-mail please add in your child's name, year group and tutor group.
- 2. You will then be sent an e-mail attachment with a username and password to activate your ParentPay account. When you first log in you will be asked to provide an e-mail address and re-set your username and password.
- 3. You will need to be provided with a username and password for each child you have in school.
- 4. If you have more than one child in school, either in this school or another school in Ceredigion (for example Primary School) you will be able to manage these within your one ParentPay ac count.
- 5. Once activated, you will be able to view your child's balance, make payments, and view transaction history at any time.

Please note that ParentPay is not the same as Parentmail – you may already be registered for Parentmail, but if you have not activated a ParentPay account you will not be able to make and view payments. Information on the ParentPay system can also be found on www.parentpay.com.

Senior Maths Challenge 2020 Result

UKMT maths challenges are run by University of Leeds to encourage mathematical reasoning, precision of thoughts and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems. Certificates are awarded to the highest scoring 40% of the candidates (Gold: Silver: Bronze = 1 : 2: 3).

It is fantastic to see how year 12 are settling into the Sixth Form despite the difficult year 11 they faced due to covid-19. They are embracing opportunities that are sent by email from various universities and via the Seren network. Many have signed up to university and apprenticeships webinars and are increasingly aware of the huge choice of courses available to them. Students have also signed up to work with a PhD student in the new year, in the arts or the sciences and this experience will be invaluable when writing their personal statements at the end of year 12 / beginning of year 13. They are learning to work independently as they are aware of the challenges of increasing workload and demands that studying A levels/level 3 BTECS bring.

Year 13

We are delighted to announce that many students have obtained Oxbridge interviews this year for a wide range of subjects including: Asian and Middle Eastern Studies, Maths, Law, History/Politics, English, Architecture, Computer Science, Chemical Engineering and Psychology. Congratulations to the students who have gained Oxbridge interviews as very few prospective university students achieve this. Students have also achieved interviews for Medicine in Exeter, Sheffield, Bristol and the University of East Anglia. Veterinary interviews have been achieved in Cambridge and Liverpool and Dentistry interviews in Cardiff and Plymouth. We also have a student who has gained a place on the Sutton Trust programme that enables state school students the chance to explore studying in the US. The student has an interview in Columbia University which is even more competitive than Oxbridge!

We are also excited for the students who have gained offers for Earth Science, Football Coaching and Performance Analysis, Biomedical Science, English, Architecture, Economics to mention but a few. The students from Penglais hope to study a vast range of subjects in universities in all four corners of the UK from St Andrews to Exeter to East Anglia and Aberystwyth.

We are extremely grateful to ex students and staff from Penglais and from the local community for their unfailing support in helping our students prepare for these interviews. They include Mr Richard John (Law), Mr Haydn Davey (History and Politics), Mr Byron Jenkins (Architecture), Mr Mohsen Elabbadi (Chemical Engineering), Professor Hannah Dee (Computer Science), Mr Adrian Wells (Mathematics), Dr Sue Fish (Medicine) and Dr Donogh Mc Keogh (Medicine). Also, to Ms Hughes for helping when we needed additional support (Asian and Middle Eastern Studies, Dentistry), Thank you!

Sixth form students had "the best day ever" on Friday when food was served at lunchtime in the Sixth Form Centre. I was amazed by how much some of them could eat, and this was following their rather substantial packed lunch! Year 12 Student—Lloyd


In April this year Llais Penglais published a 'Good News Story', my work with COVID-19 statistics. Every day since the lockdown in mid-March, I have posted slides to my Twitter account and updated my website with the daily Covid -19 infection rate figures for Wales. It was a huge challenge to get the maps working as intended but thankfully, I found a way of making them (almost) perfect.


Since returning to school in September I have carried on with this and, as the cases have risen, my work has become as important as ever. Every day as soon I get home from school, I hop on my computer and get to work updating the website and slide. It takes about an hour a day, although this time has reduced as I have found more ways to reduce manual work and save time.

There is some end in sight for the pandemic and, despite my interest in the work I have been doing, I hope that the recent vaccine breakthroughs will go a long way towards things returning to normal. I am not planning to stop the statistical and cartographic work on this pandemic but with increasing school commitments I am having to ensure it doesn't monopolise my time.

Beyond the pandemic, I have started working on a website that will host election results for the 2021 Senedd election in May. Doing this work has helped me to develop new skills, practice old ones and given me the opportunity to meet some inspiring people who have given invaluable advice along the way. It has opened doors to many career paths as cartography and statistics, and has really boosted my interest in science (especially Biology) and into some of the more specific concepts in epidemiology and virology.

The biggest lesson I have learned from this is if you have an idea that you think is big, important or even just interesting, do it. Work around any obstacles you come across and ignore anyone who tries to hold you back. Your idea could end up helping many people; it makes for some excellent content for personal statements too!

Year 12 School Representatives

What is the Mental Health Ambassador Program?

Mental health is something that touches everyone's lives in some form or fashion during their lives. Be it themselves or someone they know. So as a school we are united in the belief that we should prepare all students with the skills they need to succeed in later life. As part of that we feel having an open conversation about the issues around mental health is important. We believe that the best way to have that open conversation is by having young people taking the sessions for younger year groups.

During the summer it was planned that Year 12 and Year 13 would receive training to take these sessions. However, since COVID-19 and the creation of bubbles the ability to mix year groups have made that difficult. We as a school want to make this clear that these sessions will be run in some way however not how we originally planned during the summer break. The current plan is for class teachers to deliver the sessions similarly to how sixth form students would have. So to clarify there will not be any deviation from the information and content in these sessions just the method they are delivered.

On a personal level all Mental Health Ambassadors feel strongly about raising awareness and support for people struggling with issues surrounding mental health. We want to help make people aware of the support the school offer. Talking from my own experience when I was seriously struggling, I didn't know the school offered any support and once the school put me in contact with specialist agencies I began to feel better. The support the school offer in no way can be under stated they literally changed my life. I was on the verge of being excluded and now I'm in their six-form studying chemistry, geography and history. I don't want anyone else to be in a similar situation.

I urge anyone who is struggling or knows someone who is struggling to speak out. The school can facilitate meetings with both the school counselor and the educational phycologist.

This summer I was very fortunate to attend the University of Cambridge LPN (low participation neighborhoods) Summer School. It consisted of a 2-week course following a subject of our choice. Unfortunately, the visit to Cambridge itself was cancelled but I was able to follow the course online. The experience overall was amazing. I got to meet a lot of people my age from schools around Wales and the UK. I selected the biochemistry medical course; this



included three lectures over two weeks from university experts and professors. The program also included useful information such as the finance options to fund undergraduate studies and the admissions procedures to Cambridge. As part of the program we were able to meet some undergraduates currently studying at Cambridge. This allowed us to ask questions and familiarize ourselves with university life. The meetings were informative, well organized and supervised. The summer school arranged extra-curricular activities such as icebreakers and escape rooms, a great way to socialize with other students on the program. The LPN Summer School experience overall was helpful and fun to be part of, and I am looking forward to the second part of the program next summer. Omair (Year 12)

National Youth Choir of Wales 2020

Four Penglais students were recently successful in auditioning for the National Youth Choir of Wales. The students concerned are Lucille (Y13, soprano), Lucy (Y13, alto), Matilda (Y13, alto) and Tesni (Y12, alto). This is the singing equivalent of 'playing for Wales'; we are extremely proud that the four students will be representing their country (and the school) in this way.

They will be taking part in a residential course in August 2021, conducted by Tim Rhys-Evans MBE. The choir will then undertake a tour of Wales; you can hear them at the Ffwrnes Theatre in Llanelli on 2nd September, the Prichard-Jones Hall in Bangor on 3rd September and the Dora Stoutzker Hall (Royal Welsh College of Music & Drama) in Cardiff on 4th September.

We are extremely proud of their achievement, as they represent Wales in this way.

Wales of the West End

Instrumentalists from across the age ranges at Penglais have been taking part in a series of online rehearsals organised by Welsh musicians who usually play in the pits of West End Theatres. The project 'West End of Wales' is funded by the Arts Council of Wales. Penglais students will be recording their parts for the ensemble at home, which will then be edited together. These will be viewable in an online concert on 22nd December; note that this concert is external, and not organised by Penglais.

We will also be uploading one video per day throughout December, showcasing the musical talent of Penglais students. Remembrance Day 2020

On November 11th 2020, four brass players at Penglais represented the school by sounding the Last Post at 11.00. The students involved were George (Y13), lestyn (Y12), Rhys (Y12) and Jacob (Y8).

They led the two minute silence, by playing both the 'Last Post' and the 'Reveillie'. This involved playing outside in cold and windy conditions; all students showed great professionalism and musicality, despite the inclement conditions. Well done to all four of them.

Musical Futures 2021

National Youth Arts Wales have recently begun a national programme for song-writers, DJs and performers across Wales (to represent the best of the country's talent). They only choose 24 students from across Wales to take part; five of them in 2021 will be from Penglais! This is a huge honour.

Congratulations are due to Charlie (Y13, songwriter and guitarist), Rhys (Y12, producer, songwriter, guitarist and vocalist), Lucy and Matilda (Y13, singer/songwriters as a duo) and Lucille (songwriter, producer and performer).

The five students will be taking part in a series of six online masterclasses with industry experts in January, before joining a resident course in the Wales Millennium Centre at Easter 2021. This will involve rehearsing and writing together, before a national tour of Wales in the first week of August 2021. This will involve performances in both North and South Wales, as well as on the main stage at the Eisteddfod in Tregaron.

Out of 24 students from across Wales, it is especially pleasing that 5 of them have been chosen from Penglais. Well done to the students concerned.
