### Students' Perspectives on their Return to School

#### Y12 Student:

"I never realised how much I missed human interaction until I returned to the Sixth Form Centre. Even though we were all in masks, I felt a sense of normality and the satisfaction of not getting a headache from looking at my computer screen all day."

#### Year 12 Student:

"Lockdown was taken two ways, it seemed. It was taken with messy desks, dodgy Wi-Fi, and sleeping in past twelve. It was also taken with a new lease of creativity, a chance to learn something a new, perhaps a newfound drive for independent learning.

I think lockdown was without a doubt difficult. It challenged the way we are used to learning, replaced people with computers and classrooms with Teams. However, I think it also taught us some valuable skills. How to motivate and engage ourselves without the concrete unity and companionship of other pupils and teachers. Learning alone is often a challenge, and in the lead-up to assessments, we will be revising by ourselves. I think lockdown has given us the ability to do this effectively. Lockdown has given us a different perspective on individual learning and the way we process information and ideas while we are alone. Going forward, this is a skill we can use to really get a grasp of our subjects over Easter and in the lead-up to assessments."

#### Year 13 Student:

"Despite the doom and gloom, school has been at least one positive thing to focus on during these difficult times. Best of all, as our lessons were being recorded any funny moments were also recorded. It is like having a virtual memory book of our bests moments as a class which will eventually become precious memories as time goes on. My fears and concerns about returning to Sixth Form soon disappeared after the first week back at school. The sense of community that I felt in Year 12 was stronger than ever before as students and teachers were delighted to physically be in school after what felt like an eternity."

# Music News

#### **Burns Night - Online Concert**

Students put on a short online concert to celebrate the birthday of the bard Robert Burns. The evening saw a series of readings, performances of Scottish repertoire and a mini-ceilidh. The evening finished (as is tradition) with a performance of 'Auld Lang Syne'.

### **Dydd Miwsig Cymru**

On 5th February, students put on a lunchtime concert to celebrate Dydd Miwsig Cymru. The concert featured performances entirely in the Welsh language, and featured a mixture of traditional repertoire and brand new music.

#### **Music Futures – National Youth Arts Wales**

Two groups of musicians from Penglais have been taking part in a 'Music Futures' scheme, run by National Youth Arts Wales. They achieved this through a process of application; there are 24 young musicians across Wales taking part, of whom 6 of them are from Penglais! The students are currently enjoying weekly online workshops with mentors, focussing on the craft of song writing. The mentors are Tumi Williams (Afro Cluster) and Osian Williams (Candelas). The Music department at Penglais are collaborating with Ysgol Rhydywaun in Merthyr to make this happen. The Penglais students will be take part in a digital residency with Kizzy Crawford over the Easter holidays, before taking part in a short tour of performances across Wales in August.

### **Learning Instruments**

As we approach the Summer term, it is time to start thinking about instrumental and vocal lessons. ### S4C - 'Heno' / Bronglais FM

To promote the concert, a number of students appeared on 'Heno'. Well done to all students involved. Two students (Ashe and Hugo) also appeared live on Radio Bronglais FM on the day of the concert, to advertise our online concert. This involved a twenty minute slot, talking about life as a musician at Penglais during a pandemic.





#### St David's Day

The Penglais Music Department put on an online concert for St David's Day, featuring musicians from across the school. This was our 25th annual concert, as well as being exactly a year to the day since our trip to Cardiff to sing at the Senedd. It also marked almost exactly a year since our first online concert. To mark the occasion, students performed a variety of Welsh-themed repertoire. The concert featured special messages of encouragement from professional musicians across Wales and beyond; these included Kirsty Williams MS (Minister for Education), John Rutter CBE, Catrin Finch, Alis Huws (Offical Harpist to HRH The Prince of Wales), members of 'Only Men Aloud' and more. The concert ended with a spirited rendition of 'Mae Hen Wlad Fy Nhadau', featuring as many students as possible.

#### **National Youth Choir of Wales**

Four of our students have recently taken part in a workshop led by Tim Rhys Evans MBE, as part of their year with the National Youth Choir of Wales. The students will also be taking part in a residency in Carmarthen in late August, followed by a short concert tour across Wales.

#### **World Book Day**

Students took part in an online concert on the evening of 4th March, to celebrate World Book Day. The concert programme featured literary-themed repertoire, all recorded and performed by musicians at Penglais. Many thanks to Liz Kennedy (librarian) for her help in organising this concert.

### **PA System Donation**

In March 2020, the Penglais PTA kindly paid for a brand new PA system for the music department. This is a portable system, which was intended to be used for our regular concerts at the Museum (as well as for PTA events). Of course, circumstances dictated otherwise; however we have now finally had a chance to use it! The PA system is currently installed on a temporary stage in the music department, ready to be used for recitals in our GCSE and A Level classes in late March. We are looking forward to using it for 'proper' (not online) concerts in the future, and are immensely grateful to the Penglais PTA for their generous grant.

### **Penglais Proms**

We will be taking a short break from online concerts in April and May, whilst the GCSE and A Level classes focus on non-exam assessments. However, the 'Penglais Proms' concert series will return in late June. The 'Penglais Proms' are a series of lunchtime concerts throughout late June and early July, featuring the pupils of Ysgol Penglais School. The concerts are based on the 'Proms' series in the Royal Albert Hall in London (as pioneered by Sir Henry Wood), and feature different themes each week. All pupils are welcome to take part. #### **Vet Application Process**




