Headteacher's Message

It has been another interesting and challenging year at Penglais. Covid certainly hasn't disappeared, but we have succeeded in our aim of keeping the school open throughout the academic year. It has been challenging at times, particularly when there were high levels of staff and student absences due to Covid, however our community spirit and everyone pulling together allowed us to overcome such challenges.

We have seen the academic year fall back into its more normal rhythm. The exam season ran smoothly for the first time in three years and our students in Years 10, 11, 12 and 13 deserve a huge congratulations for succeeding in sitting their first set of external exams. We are very proud of the way they approached the exams and look forward to celebrating with them on the exam results days in August.

During the summer term we welcomed Estyn to the school. Eight inspectors spent a week in the school, observing 90% of lessons; talking to many students; meeting with parents and governors and meeting with many leaders, teachers and non-teaching staff in the school. They certainly managed to get a very full view of the school and the report will be published during the holidays. We will share the report with parents on return.

During the last half of the summer term, we re-introduced extra-curricular activities and clubs and it has been great to see students enjoying the extra parts of school that is so important for them and the school as a community. Sports Day on Monday was a huge success where nearly all students participated, whether in individual or team events, or in walking the Milo Mile. We have raised an amazing £459 from Milo's Mile which will be shared between Ty Hafan and our Learning Support Centre. Congratulations to all involved.

We will be saying a farewell to a few members of staff this year. Please see the end of term letter with further details. It has been a pleasure and a privilege to be working with our staff, students, governors and parents again this year. Thank you all for your support. 


Sports News

Penglais Raptors Junior NBA Finals Day

Penglais School represented the Toronto Raptors at the Junior NBA Finals day after qualifying back in March. The team (pictured above right), consisting of Dhayne, Connor, Ben, Amelie, Kylan, Dominic, Olivia and Austin (all Year 7), won their quarter-final 14-13 versus the Minnesota Timberwolves. They then lost their Semi-Final to eventual champions the Charlotte Hornets (Cathays High School). This put the team into the 3rd place play-off and were cheered on by a loud section of fellow Penglais students brought down by Mrs Phillips with their good luck signs; they beat the San Antonio Spurs 15-14 to claim 3rd place overall in the whole of Wales.

A superb achievement for the team who were all Year 7 with the competition being Year 7 and 8 combined. The whole side played amazingly throughout the tournament but a special mention for Dhayne, who won the Northern Conference Male MVP Award beating competition from 16 other schools.





Students from Penglais who have represented Wales in sporting events, were among 16 elite athletes chosen as baton bearers as it travelled through Wales and towards its final destination in Birmingham for the start of the Commonwealth Games in July. The baton arrived from Tywyn and was carried by the baton bearers in a relay from Plascrug Leisure Centre, through the town to the Vale of Rheidol Railway. The baton began its journey on October 7th 2021 with Her Majesty the Queen placing her message to the Commonwealth into the baton. The baton is now on its 269-day journey through the 72 Commonwealth nations, covering over 90,000 miles before returning to Birmingham for the start of the games on the 28th July. Our students taking part were Cameron, Jac, Kai, Alex, Daniel, Josh (Ex-Penglais), Órla and Ruadhán.

All faculties have been working very hard this year to prepare for our new curriculum. The new curriculum will be trialled with year 7 from September 2022 and rolled out to year 7 & 8 in September 2023, and year 9 in September 2024. Faculties have been researching curriculum and assessment theory and practice, as well as exploring subject based pedagogy, in order to provide high quality learning experiences for all students.

New Curriculum

Curriculum developments in Faculties

Leaders and teachers in all faculties have embraced the opportunity provided by the new curriculum to research, trial and evaluate new approaches to teaching and learning in subject areas. The focus is on high quality learning experiences that enable all students to make very good progress to the point that they reach 'mastery' in a particular skill or topic within a subject.

Examples of this exciting curriculum development work are below:

(RE)	using the story of Martin Luther King based on the text 'Free at Last'. Purposeful interdisciplinary links to English using reading, writing and oracy strategies.
	Interdisciplinary links to concepts in social sciences.
International	Research into local history/ geography – development of Cynefin.
Languages	Development of tourist leaflet to present information in the target language.
	Mediate conversation in the Aberystwyth tourist office using target language.
	Builds interdisciplinary links to Humanities.


Sixth Form News

Lessons from Auschwitz - Ella in Year 12

At the start of 2022, myself and Oli were selected to take part in the Holocaust Educational Trust's 'Lessons from Auschwitz' programme. Over a series of three live sessions and some individual work, we learnt more about the Holocaust and how different the experience was for each person involved. In particular we focused on humanising the Holocaust through looking at 'the book of names', perpetrators, and individual stories. During the live sessions we were led in learning about these individual stories and even had the opportunity to listen to a live testimony from a survivor. The programme normally takes its participants out to visit Auschwitz, however we were not able to go because of covid. Despite this we were able to gain some understanding of what the camp is like now through a VR experience run in one of the live sessions. We then had the opportunity to complete a project based around what we had learnt. Oli and I wrote and published an article on the topic for the Sixth Sense (the sixth form creative arts magazine). This programme was deeply moving and taught us a lot about the importance of remembering history and is something we would both highly recommend to Year 12 next year.

Languages

We are lucky in Penglais to have a native Chinese teacher who has joined us to support Mrs Huws in her Mandarin lessons. During the week 4-8 July, Penglais was chosen by Lampeter University to showcase the excellent work that we do. This involved video lessons; the use of new and exciting resources and a big Chinese lunch to finish. The students learned all about Chinese dining etiquette and cuisine. Delicious!

Kronburg Exchange

Did you know that each year in Penglais we have students who study German at our German lunchtime language club? This year we have had students sit GCSE and AS German exams. In order to support these students and the exchange programme between Aberystwyth and Kronburg, we have welcomed German students and teachers for the last part of our term. This is a great opportunity to support community languages and make connections with European countries. This exchange programme started in 1980 and it has been a great experience for our host families. The itinerary included lessons at Penglais; day trips to local areas of interest; dolphin watching and meeting our town Mayor Councillor Talat Chaudhri.

MFL Mentoring project

We have completed another year of our student mentoring project and many of our Year 9 students have thoroughly enjoyed working with students from the University of Wales Cardiff. Penglais students have worked on language projects which make links between language skills and employability. This year they have mainly worked with engineering students in their final year at University.

Student Leadership Team News

Penglais Student Charter - Sabrina and Lexie, Yr 12

We have been working on a Penglais Student Charter alongside the Student Leadership Team (StLT). Primarily, we wanted to make the Equality and Diversity Policy something accessible and tangible to Penglais students in all years, by allowing them to work towards particular 'values' that they understand and appreciate. So, on top of the Penglais School Values that we already have, we have collaborated with students to establish three key values, and what they mean, for us to implement into Penglais life. This is known as the Penglais Student Charter.

To ensure that students would be willing to work towards promoting equality and equity in the school environment, the StLT worked on creating a list of words as a starting point for particular 'values' that the students are most passionate about. We then created and sent out a PowerPoint to form groups in all the years, where students voted for their top three values that they wanted to see in the Charter.

After looking at the results, the StLT found that the three top values that students felt should define us, were knowledge, equality, and respect. To develop these values further, we wanted to elaborate on what exactly these values meant for the student body, so that they understand exactly what the school community wants to work towards. So, the StLT again worked together to create five key bullet points of what 'we value' from that key word. We then sent this out to the year groups, who gave feedback on what they wanted to see added or changed from the bullet points.

This is now our Student Charter. These are our values for knowledge. It considers our privilege to be educated, learning about diversity, and learning in a considerate and equal working environment suited to our needs. These are our values for equality. Students were considerate of both equality in the classroom and equality in the corridors, in our language and how we behave. And these are our values for respect. Respect, for students, comes in the form of listening respectfully, acting respectfully, and being able to express ourselves with other people's respect.

The final values reveal exactly how the students feel the school should be like in terms of equality and diversity. For example, it was interesting to see how knowledge was a popular value, and how students considered their privilege to be educated, both academically and about other cultures of students. It was also important for students to see that the process of promoting equality and showing respect did not just occur in the classroom, but also in the wider school environment – in our language and behaviour to one another.

The next step for the Student Charter is to implement its values into school life, to improve student behaviour in line with our Policy. Firstly, the Student Leadership Team will work to formally introduce the Charter to staff and students by September - this has already begun with assemblies to year groups to explain the work we have done through the Policy. We also plan to put the Charter on posters to put around the school and the website, and have already considered some student-friendly prototypes.

Then, we aim to implement discussion and activities surrounding the Charter values within form groups. This might start with members of the Student Leadership Team going around forms, and starting conversations about the different values. Hopefully then, the Charter will become a regular part of form time discussion – this will increase the awareness of students of the importance of equality, equity and diversity in Penglais.

Student Leadership Team News

A message from Maxita, former Head Girl to all Penglais Students

My name is Maxita, and I have been your Head Girl over the past school year, alongside Michael who was Head Boy. We have both enjoyed leading the Student Leadership Team, or StLT, alongside Mrs Porter working with pupils from across the year groups to improve the school. In this article, we'll be giving you an overview of what the tSLT has achieved over the school year, and with the help of Sabrina and Lexie, will be revealing the new student charter and explaining what it's about.

At the beginning of the year, one of our goals was to spread out the leadership throughout the StLT. We were aware of a certain 'type' of student that often-become representatives, which could stop us from making decisions that would benefit all the students in school. You may remember that we were looking for new form reps and year reps, and with your help, alongside form teachers and heads of year, we were able to carry out a selection process which achieved more accurate representation in the StLT, with pupils from a range of academic and personal backgrounds. This meant that the StLT could address the issues that mattered to you and represent your views, no matter who you were.

For example, your year reps have discussed areas for improvement in school, such as provision for mental health, as well as issues, such as behaviour on buses or the PE changing rooms. These issues were raised with the appropriate teachers, and have been resolved, or will be another area for the StLT to investigate in the next school year.

Over the year, the school has held two extremely successful fundraisers. In the autumn term, an own clothes day was held, in which £885 was raised thanks to your efforts. This was split between the BBC Children in Need appeal which received £535, and Mind Aberystwyth which received £350, with the donations being put towards services for young people. In the spring term, another fundraiser was held in response to the War in Ukraine, and thanks to the swift work of the StLT, a range of fundraising activities were held, such as cake sales and competitions. These allowed the school to raise £880.

After Christmas, one of our main goals was to help change and improve the Equality and Diversity policy. This is a policy that is in place to help students feel safer by combatting discrimination in school, helping us achieve equality. During the spring and summer term, we have worked with students such as yourselves to come up with a student motto, and a student charter. We asked your form groups to come up with three words which you felt were important in tackling discrimination and harmful behaviour, which were then combined by the StLT to form the student values. Furthermore, our year 12 reps worked on the policy with the Equality and Diversity working group, communicating between the governors and SLT, and helping to develop the charter.

Firstly, I'd like to thank the form reps and year reps for your hard work this year, as well as the Sixth Form prefect team; you've shown great amounts of maturity in your work this year. I'd also like to thank all pupils for working with your form and year reps to help the StLT improve your school experience, we can't do it without your help! In addition, I'd like to thank all the teachers in the school who have helped the StLT this year.

In the next school year, the StLT will be led by the next head boy and head girl, who will be selected from the current year 12. They will be continuing the work of the StLT: working on school improvements, carrying out fundraisers, and continuing to implement the student charter. Make sure you get just as involved as you did this year, may even more, so that you can improve the school experiences for yourselves and those around you. Science & Digital Competency News

Biology department

Year 12 Biology students had the opportunity to enter the UK Intermediate Biology Olympiad, where they competed against students from schools all over Britain to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of Biology.

Congratulations to Matthew Joseph, Seren Overton Jones, and Austin Thomas who gained silver awards, Luke Lewis-Wakelin and Marcie Neal who were awarded bronze, Ifan Blake, Amber Bowen, Noah Maylor, Daniel Van-Vlezen who were highly commended and Bruce Ferguson Payne, Charley Gamzatova, Salma Mohamed and Hannah Williams who were commended.

Year 12 students also visited castle rocks to survey the distribution of different seaweed species as part of their A level Population Size and Ecosystems module.

Biodiversity survey following No Mow May

As part of their Biodiversity and Classification module, Year 9 and 10 Biology GCSE students surveyed the flowering plants growing in the Penglais grounds in May and June. We used the iNaturalist app along with guidebooks to identify over twenty different species, many of them wild, providing a habitat for bees, butterflies and other insects.

ICT

Swansea University staff visited Penglais recently to run a Welsh Government funded Technocamp for year 10 ICT students. The workshop was a fantastic introduction to web design coding and the students' feedback was very positive - they have gained very valuable skills.

Penglais Readers


