




## Student Achievements

### **Food & Nutrition News**

On Friday 10th February 2023 the Year 10 Food and Nutrition students welcomed Rachel's Dairy into school. Jo Tett-Davies (Technical Manager) and Ben Kinsey brought along a sample of different yoghurts for the students to try and explained how the product was made using various different cultures.

The aim of the visit was to deepen the knowledge that has been taught this term around dairy products and to look at some sensory testing models used in the industry.

It was great to hear about how the company started back in 1952 becoming the first ever certified organic dairy and hearing how it has grown and been endorsed by royalty over the decades. The company is now owned by French firm 'Groupe Lactalis' who purchased Rachel's Dairy in 2010 and has the capacity to produce 26,0000 tons of yoghurt per year - that is the equivalent of 1 million pots every week.

Our students learnt how they could make yoghurt at home by heating milk, adding starter cultures and incubating. They were then shown how this is scaled up and made at an industrial level. It was good to hear about pasteurisation and heat treatment again as this was knowledge recall for year 10.

We also found out about some of the careers involved in the industry which are vast, ranging from marketing, quality testing and nutritional analysis through to quality testing, distribution and engineering to name a few. Lots of these jobs our students were unaware of so to have that insight was very valuable.

We also got to taste some of the yoghurt and carry out some sensory testing. We looked at the viscosity (thickness) of different yoghurts, the flavour and the acidity and plotted our results using star profiles, ranking and rating tests. This was very useful for our year 10 students to do as this is a requirement in year 11 for their assessment work.

I would like to thank Jo and Ben for giving up their valuable time and of course a big thank you to our year 10 food students for participating so well throughout the session. We look forward to being able to invite Rachel's Dairy back into school next year.







## Design & Technology News

This year in Design Technology, Product Design students have been undertaking company-led design tasks in both Year 7 and 8. These tasks are set by one local company and one Welsh design company and require the students to use their creativity and imagination to design products that could be sold in real life settings. Both design tasks are part of the departments' new curriculum trials that have been underway this year and the tasks have proved to have been very successful in student outcomes and skill development.

In Year 7, the department teamed up with local company Aber Outdoors to set the brief to design a product for use at the beach by a particular target market. Aber Outdoors is a recently established family run business who have a shared passion for the outdoors and the positive influence paddle sports can have on personal wellbeing from a physical, mental and emotional point of view. They provide safe, fun and educational paddle sport experiences from Aber Marina so have an expertise of the beach and the area where we live. The students have produced excellent ideas and a great deal of the work is well above that expected from 11 and 12 year old students.







The second design task was set for our Year 8 students by former student Luke Roberts who now works as a Product Designer for Zest Outdoor Living. Luke has visited the classes previously last year to support in a design task and his expertise in the design industry is both inspiring and helpful for the students. Luke designs products for the garden as Zest are an award-winning product design company who have been designing and manufacturing wooden garden products for over 35 years. Their products are sold in stores such as Charlies and Wayfair. The design task was to design a new, innovative product for outdoor living and students were again encouraged to be as creative and imaginative as possible. Luke provided videos to the students to introduce each stage of the task and also included videos of his workplace and what it is like to work as a designer. This supports elements of the new curriculum and also highlights potential careers in the design industry.

Both design tasks for half of the year groups in Year 7 and 8 have been assessed. The remaining half of the year will now undertake the same design task and their work will be assessed in the summer. The best three designs in each class will be shortlisted by the Design Technology teachers and then narrowed down to the best five in each year group. These will be sent off to the relevant company who will choose an overall winner. So far, work previewed by Aber Outdoors has received excellent feedback with the company owner very impressed by both the high quality design skills and creative ideas. We all look forward to seeing the other half of the work over the coming months.



### **Football News**

WELSH Schools Under 18s, captained by Aberystwyth's Cameron, a Year 13 Ysgol Penglais student, secured an impressive 4-0 against their Australian counterparts at Park Avenue.

Wales deserved more from their first half endeavours but they blew the visitors away after the break.
