# **Sports News**

#### **Gymnastics**

#### Hockey

Penglais U14 and Senior sides have been entered into the Ceredigion league and will play their final matches away against Lampeter before half term. The U14's won their first match against Newcastle Emlyn 4-0, lost 2-0 to Penweddig, won 2-0 against Tregaron, 2-2 at home to Bro Teifi, 0-0 at home against Aberaeron.

Senior girls also won their first match 2-0 against Newcastle Emlyn, drew 1-1 against Tregaron and lost to both Bro Teifi and Penweddig.

#### Welsh Cup Competition

Senior girls beat Aberaeron away 5-2, Bro Teifi home 6-3 and Welshpool away 4-2. We are now waiting to see who we will play in the knock-out rounds.

U15 girls lost in the final in the tournament winning 2 and losing 1, U13 girls lost 2 and drew 1 in the tournament.

Year 7 boys lost a hard-fought game v Penweddig, eventually going down 7-0 with a scoreline that didn't reflect the performance. Year 8 came 2nd in their group in the Blaendolau tournament and unfortunately did not progress to the national rounds this year. Year 9 have a place in the Ceredigion final after wins against Lampeter (4-0) and Bro Teifi (5-0). Year 10 are into the national rounds for the first time after beating Bro Teifi 5-4 on penalties during the Blaendolau tournament. Finally, the Senior team are into the Ceredigion final after beating Bro Teifi 4-0 with goals from Luke B x2, Steffan G and Ruadhan.

With the foundations laid last year, the number of players taking part in extracurricular rugby has increased enormously. Over 70 students have been involved in trainings and games. With the standard of rugby at an all time high in Ceredigion, it was always going to be tough. Next term will be equally exciting, with a tournament planned for years 7 and 9 and the remaining fixtures. A special mention to Michael, Harri, Austin, Steffan and Carter who have represented Ceredigion U16's in the National Dewar Shield Competition.

## **Design Technology News**

Part of the Design Technology new curriculum involves our department partnering with local and Welsh companies as well as design industry professionals. In Year 7 students undertake a design project for local company 'Aber Outdoors' to design a beach product. In Year 8 our students undertake a design project for 'Zest 4 Leisure', who are a product design company based in Wrexham, to design a product for use in the garden and outdoor living.

These links bring careers experience and knowledge to our curriculum whilst also giving students the opportunity to work on design briefs set by real companies and not just teachers in our school. They also broaden the students understanding of Product Design in the real world and the type of work real designers undertake. As students are not tasked to make their designs for these briefs, the short projects allow the students to be as creative as they can be without any restrictions from making skills. Over the past year we have found these projects to be a great success and there have been plenty of examples of excellent design thinking from our youngest two year groups.


During the past year our teachers identified the top three designs in each class and at the end of the year judged these and shortlisted the top five in Year 7 and top five in Year 8. These were then sent to Jack Edwards owner of Aber Outdoors and Luke Roberts a former Penglais Student who works as Product Designer at Zest 4 Leisure and both chose a winner for each design task.

In Year 7 the winner was Zofia and in Year 8 the winner was Brooke with both receiving vouchers.









Year 8 Brooke

Jack at Aber Outdoors was very impressed with the high quality of design work and the creativity of our students. Zofia had identified a problem around accessibility of the beach for those who use wheelchairs and had designed an innovative wheel cover for wheelchairs which would allow the wheelchair to move over the sand. A very functional idea that would be of benefit to many users and an idea that makes the beach more accessible.

Luke at Zest 4 involved other product designers from the company to judge the overall winner and they chose Brooke's garden swing egg chair with multiple other functions. Their reasons included the concept clearly demonstrating the function (sketching), clearly highlighting additional features of the product (good communication skills), consideration of the materials used and how it's fitted together (design for manufacture and assembly), and including a costing which is always very useful when selling concepts. Brooke's concept demonstrated great design thinking and she had applied the design process well in her final concept pitch.

Due to the success of the links with these professionals, the design tasks are both going ahead again this year and both Jack and Luke, as well as our Design Technology teachers, are very much looking forward the students' work.

# Modern Foreign Languages News

#### International languages

Language learners at Key Stage 3 are making a great start this term with their studies in International Languages with French, Mandarin and Spanish being taught here at Penglais. As part of the New Curriculum for Wales and supporting our learners to become informed citizens of Wales and the world Year 8 French students researched "La Francophonie", the world community of French speaking countries as their first homework and below is example of an excellent homework piece by Maya, Year 8





#### MFL Mentoring Project.

We will be participating in the MFL Student Mentoring Project again this term, with a student from Aberystwyth University, who is currently studying German and International Politics. Our student mentor will be running a combination of language workshops for Year 9 and mentoring sessions for Year 8. During the sessions our student mentor uses bespoke multilingual resources, which focus on themes not typically explored in the classroom. Pupils will be able to explore which ever language and culture interests them.
